came to Canada and

settled in Caledon Twp,²
North of Toronto. Cleared
up farms married and
had quite large families
These two men names
were Adam & James
Melvins Great-G. F. name
was Adam, and his wife
name was Hillock the other
Brother married into ~~the~~
the Reybourn family, and
there are Hellocks & Reybourns
"Reybourn".)
