Dear Mother

I received your long looked for letter this morning and I cannot tell or express my feelings I was so glad to hear from you once more and while Ben is with us we have wrote to you often but I dont suppose you have got them and now that we have so much to do we will try and make out to write if we have a bout 3 or more in our hospital and it is some work to get them enough to eat I am all ways busy Ben looks well and better than ever and he will have by Sunday or

Friday he says he has such a short time to day and it is so uncomfiment to get round and so he says if the road was through to Corinth which will be soon we could come through in 36 hours from here you said you was glad we had come to a stoping place and so am I but we wont be here long as the army is moving on so fast and we have to keep close after them I told Mrs Glassburn last week that I would go home and she is not willing and Ben says I came out for the war and I wont not to back out and while I am so well I never was in better health in my life I have gained about 10 pounds since I came here and then we have so many sick that we could not have now and the next move will be to the north
